

Arizona In State University Core Competency Requirements: Competency requirement of 4 years English, 4 years Math (Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II and one course requiring Algebra II as a prerequisite), 3 years Laboratory Science, 2 years Social Science (1 year which must be US/American History), 2 years of the same Second Language, and 1 year Fine Arts or CTE. Students must earn a minimum of a 2.0 unweighted GPA in each competency subject area.

Application &

Deadline: Apply on-line at nau.edu/apply. Rolling admissions; Recommendation is to apply as early as possible for best scholarship, financial aid and housing options.

Admission

Requirement: Arizona residents will be **offered** admission with an **unweighted** core GPA of 3.0 or higher in **core** classes with no deficiencies in the 16 required core classes. Students will be **considered** for admission if they have an unweighted core GPA of 2.5 or higher, and have no more than **one** deficiency in any **two** areas in the 16 college preparatory courses. If students have a combination of a math and lab science deficiency, they are not admissible.

Honors

College: **The essay prompts for Spring 2022 and Fall 2022 admission will be available in late Summer. The application is set to open September 1, 2021 and the Priority Deadline is November 15th, 2021 for scholarship consideration.** See the Honors webpage for updates and more information: <https://nau.edu/honors/admissions/requirements/>. In order to complete the on-line Honors application, you must first have been admitted to NAU and have your NAU ID and password. Also, please have your essay and resume ready to submit **BEFORE** clicking apply. Their application is open on a rolling admission basis, but we strongly encourage submitting application materials prior to **February 1** if a student is interested in living in the Honors Residential College. **April 1** is our priority date to ensure enrollment in a first year Honors seminar. Admission to Honors will continue through the summer *on a space available basis*. Cost is \$350 per semester for incoming freshman. More information can be found at nau.edu/honors.

Housing:

Scholarships:

Fall 2022 incoming freshman who are Arizona Residents are automatically considered for merit-based scholarships once admitted to our Flagstaff Mountain Campus. ACT/SAT scores are not required for merit-based scholarship consideration but may assist with additional scholarship monies. All merit-based scholarships are based off a student's unweighted core high school GPA in the core 16 college preparatory courses (see above for required courses). The unweighted core high school GPA a student is required to have in the core 16 college preparatory courses are listed below for each respective scholarship.

Opportunity Scholarship: \$2,500 per year	Criteria: 2.9-2.99 unweighted core high school GPA
Dean's Tuition Scholarship: \$5,000 per year	Criteria: 3.0-3.39 unweighted core high school GPA
Dean's with Distinction Scholarship: \$6,500 per year	Criteria: 3.4-3.49 unweighted core high school GPA
President's Resident Tuition Scholarship: \$8,000 per year	Criteria: 3.5+ unweighted core high school GPA

Lumberjack Scholars Award: Based on the completion and/or in-progress work of the core 16 college preparatory courses that are required for admission and a minimum 3.5 unweighted core high school GPA, with no letter grade lower than a "B" in any of the college preparatory courses. Students cannot have any deficiencies in the 16 core courses. Test scores cannot be used for eligibility. Covers up to 100% of tuition; it does not cover fees or other expenses. **Retake Policy:** Course retakes are NOT permitted in the evaluation process for the Lumberjack Scholars Award.

Renewal Criteria: All merit-based scholarships are renewable for up to 4 years if renewal criteria are met. Students must be enrolled full time and complete 30 credit hours each academic year. If the renewal criteria are not met, the amount and the award are subject to change. Additional renewal criteria can be reviewed below and on our website: <http://nau.edu/scholarships>.

Opportunity Scholarship: Maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA in university coursework.

Dean's Tuition & Dean's with Distinction Scholarship: Maintain a 2.75 cumulative GPA in university coursework.

President's Resident Tuition Scholarship & Lumberjack Scholars Award: Maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA in university coursework.
